A LITTLE BIT ABOUT OHIO LIGHT OPERA- Operetta ... comic opera ... musical comedy ... light opera. The distinctions among them are subtle, but each conjures up a bygone era of romance, conflict, dance, champagne, and swashbuckling heroes—a world in which all hearts beat in three-guarter time. For 44 seasons, The Ohio Light Opera (OLO) has preserved, promoted, and produced the finest that these art forms have to offer. Through the unwavering support of The College of Wooster and the dedication of OLO's artistic and administrative staff, the company has secured a position as America's premier venue for the production of fully-staged and fully-orchestrated lyric theater gems—works that have captivated the public over the past century and a half.



THE SHOWS WE WILL SEE-

1. GUYS & DOLLS (1950). Music and Lyrics by Frank Loesser. Book by Jo Swerling and Abe Burrows. At Ohio Light Opera, Loesser is more—"a bushel and a peck" more! No American musical has garnered more unanimously glowing accolades than Frank Loesser's 1950 musical fable Guys and Dolls. Based on the stories and characters of famed writer Damon Runyon, the music, lyrics, and book bristle with the seedy street life of New York City. The show's characters have assumed legendary recognition: gambler Sky Masterson has fallen hard for Save-A-Soul Mission reformer Sarah Brown; bookie Nathan Detroit has been engaged for 14 years to nightclub chanteuse Miss Adelaide, who laments her psychosomatic cold that has lasted just as long; and horseplayer Nicely-Nicely Johnson provides a revivalist confession ("Sit down, you're rockin' the boat") when forced to give testimony at the Mission. Song hits include: "Luck Be a Lady," "If I Were a Bell," ME AND "I've Never Been in Love Before," and "My Time of Day."

MY GIRL

2. ME & MY GIRL (1937). Music by Noel Gay. Book and Lyrics by Douglas Furber and L. Arthur Rose, Book revised by Stephen Fry, with contributions by Mike Ockrent, Ingredients for a winning musical: charm; dance aplenty, including tap; melody after melody, including a candidate ("The Lambeth Walk") for the most infectiously contagious tune of them all; and an engaging plotline centered on a less-than-posh Cockney, decked out in checkered suit and grey bowler, who learns that he is the long-lost Earl of Hareford. Don't look any further—simply come to OLO's production of Noel Gay's 1937 musical Me and My Girl. When it was revived in the mid-1980s, it took both Broadway (1400+ performances) and London (3000+ performances) by storm.

Song titles include the upbeat title song, "Hold My Hand," "Love Makes the World Go Round,"

and "Leaning on a Lamp Post," popularized in the 1960s by Herman's Hermits.



3. THE SOUND OF MUSIC (1959). Music by Richard Rodgers. Lyrics by Oscar Hammerstein II. Book by Howard Lindsay and Russel Crouse. In its inexhaustible and timeless melodies and romantic setting during one of history's darkest hours. The Sound of Music remains one of the gemstones of American musical theater. It was the last collaboration, and greatest commercial success, of Rodgers and Hammerstein, who, in their ten musicals beginning with Oklahoma!, immeasurably raised the bar of musical theater concept and production. Set in 1930s Salzburg and inspired by the real-life musical exploits of the von Trapp Family Singers, the show enchanted audiences for almost four years on Broadway and in a 1965 film that became the highest-grossing picture of all time. Hit songs include "Maria," "My Favorite Things," "Do-Re-Mi," and "Edelweiss," as well as several gems not included in the film. Bring the whole family—from your grandchildren to your grandparents.
